

Reviewing **Indo- Pak** Bilateral Relations

Quarterly Monitoring Brief

APRIL 2014- JUNE 2014

The Indian election, Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's visit to Delhi and resumption of ceasefire violations along the Line of Control (LoC) in Kashmir, dominated bilateral relations between the two neighbouring countries during the quarter under review.

Throughout April, progress in normalizing bilateral relations was put on hold as India headed to polls for the 16th Lok Sabha. The much anticipated granting of Non-Discriminate Market Access (NDMA) status to India stalled in the earlier half of April. Lack of stakeholder consensus within Pakistan, the need to delink NDMA status from election rhetoric and the desire to garner support from an incoming government in New Delhi were reported to be the main considerations in delaying the decision to normalize trade relations with India.

As election results flooded in, echoing a historic win for the Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP), Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif was one of the first heads of government to congratulate BJP's prime ministerial candidate Narendra Modi. Similarly, in a welcome and surprise initiative, Narendra Modi broke from convention and invited all SAARC heads of government to his inauguration ceremony in New Delhi.

After careful deliberation, Prime Minister Sharif accepted the invitation and attended the inauguration ceremony of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Following the inauguration, bilateral talks between the two premiers and their foreign affairs teams were held the following day. The two prime ministers also had a 10 minute one-on-one meeting.

During the meeting, Sharif reiterated Pakistan's commitment to normalize relations, restart the stalled bilateral dialogue and Pakistan's desire to resolve all outstanding issues between the two countries. Sharif also extended an invitation to the new Indian premier to visit Pakistan. Modi expressed his willingness to resolve outstanding issues with Pakistan, while highlighting India's concerns about cross-border terrorism and the trial of suspects accused of orchestrating the Mumbai attacks. Both prime ministers also expressed their willingness to move towards trade liberalization at the earliest.

The second major factor in Indo-Pak relations during this quarter was the multiple violations of the ceasefire along the LoC in the disputed region of Kashmir. The ceasefire was rocked by up to 20 violations, including an improvised explosives device (IED) blast along the LoC. The Indian army also reported foiling several infiltration attempts in the region.

Progress in granting NDMA to India, which had been gaining momentum in the previous quarter, came to a standstill. It is expected that trade normalization talks will resume after peace talks between the two countries are reinstated.

Bilateral coordination in repatriating prisoners continued this quarter. In a gesture of good will, Pakistan released and repatriated 150 Indians prisoners on the eve of Prime Minister Modi's inauguration. One additional exchange of inadvertent border crossing between the Indian Border Security Force and the Pakistan Rangers was reported in the media.

Despite PM Sharif's historic visit to New Delhi, progress in normalization of Indo-Pak relations was slow during this reporting period. It is expected to pick up pace in the coming quarter, with the possibility of meetings between commerce secretaries and foreign secretaries in the next quarter.
